#1.	#5.	New Bedford (D1 S) – 14 – 0 Time for some well deserved props after beating 2 unbeaten clubs back-to-back...some forget that the Whalers only 2 years ago played at the Garden and some key players from that club still remain including one VERY dynamic guard in Alyssa Roach...great “power” week gets them to the top spot beating Brockton and LaSalle, RI on the road and Durfee at home...now get 4 in a row at home with Brockton rematch on 2/9 then at W-H and at Durfee to end the year...good tests still to come.
#2.	#2.	Central Catholic (D1 N) – 12 – 1 On a roll now and need to win at Lowell this week to set up the rubber match (AKA WW III) in Andover on Sunday 1/31 at 7:00 NOT Monday 2/1...still like this club in the #2 spot as the average margin of victory is 26 per game if you take out the Andover battles...
#3.	#3.	Brockton (D1 S) – 12 – 1 Boxers absorb bitter 1 point loss at home to our newly crowned #1 New Bedford but did get nice power wins on the road at Durfee and hosting Franklin. Rematch at New Bedford on 2/9 should be a beauty.
#4.	#4.	Wellesley (D1 S) – 11 – 0 Won 3 straight road games and now get 3 in a row at home though their last home game was scary as Norwood almost pulled the upset but Wellesley survived by 2...still hard to judge how good this club is as they lack that big “power” win so far...true sign comes when they go back-to-back on 2/4 at L-S and then host Newton North on 2/5...hmmm.

Pentucket (D3 N) – 14 – 0 Team didn’t get truly challenged until hitting the road to blow out previously unbeaten Ipswich by 29 on Friday and then knocking off strong St. Mary’s at Emmanuel by 12 on Saturday...boy did they ever survive this challenge!...club could run the table if they stay focused and then they get the top seed in D3 North...with their defense me thinks the table will be run...they get in your face and never stop...
#6.	#14.	Oliver Ames (D2 S) – 11 – 1 I know...big jump of 8 spots but I love what this club is doing winning 11 straight and only loss is to good Foxboro club by 4 on the road then they got big payback win by 26 at home...they now get 3 on the road this week with the Friday visit to Sharon a possible good one...I had this club as one of the top 2 teams in my pre-season rankings and they are now living up to that hype in a big way...look out D2 South.

#7.	#1.	Andover (D1 N) – 10 – 3 – Road loss at NDA of Hingham without Boudreau (ankle) hurts a bit but club got right back on track when Boudreau returned the next game...and then a road loss to unbeaten (11 and 0) CMass power Wachusett by 4 is nothing to be ashamed of as Wachusett is probably the biggest team in the state and could be in the D1 state finals...still losses are losses and teams who were close behind deserve to move up the ranks.
#8.	#15.	Fontbonne (D2 S) – 12 – 0 Ducks continue to roll...They did beat Spellman earlier at full strength by 11 at home but wish Spellman was healthy when they played on the road recently and the Ducks clobbered them to give us a better “power” stick to measure them by...but this week should give us the yardstick we need to measure them as they hit the road to play Marshfield and the Archies...hmmm...both good tests.
#9.	#7.	Arlington Catholic (D2 N) – 8 – 2 Escaped barely at Somerville with a 1 point win...Roche is healthy again and the Cougars will need her at 100% as they face a nice “power” week hosting Spellman Tuesday and on the road at the Archies on Friday night...
#10.	#9.	Westford (D1 N) 11 – 1 – Nice home “power” wins over AB by 3 and then Newton South by 4 plus 2 other DCL victories but they now hit the road to face a suddenly hot Bedford team then off to L-S on Friday.
#11.	#10.	Newton South (D1 S) 10 – 2 – Tough 4 point road loss at Westford but then beat AB at home in a big DCL tussle...need to stay clean this week to set up strong finishing schedule where they play L-S, Westford, and AB again.
#12.	#11.	Newton North (D1 S) 11 – 1 – Club has won 5 straight but still wish there was more of a “power” factor here...yea Needham was a good win but Rizzo was hurt so they weren’t at full strength...hope they keep winning to set up the true test at Wellesley on 2/5.
#13.	#16.	Durfee (D1 S) -- 10 – 2 – Only losses are to Big 3 rivals #1 New Bedford and #3 Brockton...club has to be careful now as 6 of last 8 games are on the road including 2 in the Comcast Tourney.
#14.	#25.	Archbishop Williams (D3 S) – 9 – 3 – Only losses to AC on the road, plus the Big Apple tourney in NY where they lost by 2 to the #2 ranked team in RI, and to Lewis, NY (14 and 1) so this club plays the iron and is now on a roll locally with 6 straight wins including beating St. Mary’s on the road and Spellman at home...great “power” week ahead (well every week is a “power” week for this club LOL) at Fenwick and then hosting AC and unbeaten Fontbonne...hmmm.
#15.	#7.	St. Mary’s of Lynn (D3 N) – 9 – 3 Rough stretch for this club losing a 2 point tilt to AC at home then letting that loss stay in the memory bank when the Archies came to town 2 days later and gave them loss #2. Memory bank gets cleansed as they pop in 80 against Fenwick but then Pentucket brought back the bad nightmare back beating them by 12...

#17.	#18.	Cohasset (D4 S) -- 12 – 0 Carver gave them a tussle at home but this club always finds a way to win...now on the road for 3 games and Hanover could be a battle in their gym tonight...
#18.	#19.	Hull (D4 S) -- 10 – 1 Club got back on track winning 3 straight after disappointing showing in big “power” game losing to Cohasset by 19...now 2 tough road games at Norwell and Harwich then hosting Carver so the path is not easy until the rematch at Cohasset on 2/5.

#20.	#22.	Cardinal Spellman (D3 S) – 10 - 4 Crushed by Fontbonne but Coach Lamb sat 4 players including his top 2 due to nagging injuries which didn’t help as the Archies beat them by 10 but then they rallied to beat Stang and Fenwick. Good “power” game at AC Tuesday.
#21.	Cusp	Coyle Cassidy (D3 S) – 11 – 1 – Good wins over Feehan and previously unbeaten ORR show me this club belongs back in the Top 25 but have to travel to Feehan on Friday in a possible payback contest...only loss was to Spellman on the road by 3.
#22.	#12.	Franklin (D1 S) – 9 – 4 Came up short in 3 “power” games losing on the road to Sharon, OA and Brockton (for the 2 nd time)...club has played a lot of “power” games. Panthers host Foxboro in a good one on Wednesday so we’ll see which team has recovered the best.
#23.	#13.	Foxborough (D2 S) – 9 – 3 – Nice road win at Sharon but then got smoked at OA and knocked off at home by 11 to Mansfield...now at Franklin on Wednesday as they try and re-group.
#24. Tie	#24.	Stoneham (D3 N) -- 11 – 1 – Reading is just not a good gym for this crew as they lost big there last year and now the Rockets end their unbeaten streak...club rallied to win next 2 but face a Winchester team on the road that they only beat by 6 at home and then Brittany Obi Tabot on Friday in an interesting week.
#24. Tie	#24.	Melrose (D2 N) – 12 - 1 Raiders need to stay on track this week and Woburn on Friday could be a trap game as they look ahead to the following week when they get Reading and Stoneham back-to-back with the Middlesex League title up for grabs.
#24. Tie	Cusp	Acton Boxborough (D1 N) -- 9 – 4 Club had nice clutch win at home over L-S but lost 2 “power” road games at Westford and Newton South plus a somewhat surprising home loss to Bedford so got to scale them back a bit and they have Holy Name tonight in another tough one.

#25. Tie #20.	Lincoln-Sudbury (D1 N) – 8 – 3 Frustrating loss at AB on questionable call with less than a second to go but life goes on and they will as well...they have to as they hit the road to Westford on Friday and then at Newton South the following Tuesday.
#25 Tie #21.	Somerville (D1 N) – 8 – 3 Highlanders came up short in 2 “power” games losing big at #16 Lynn English without big Keisha and then she did play at home against #9 AC but they lost by 1 as a “3” at the buzzer was off the mark...rematch on Thursday with Lynn English and big Keisha will be on the court...hmmm.

Westwood (D3 S) – 10 – 1 – Ashland comes to town on Tuesday and Westwood has set this payback game up perfectly winning 8 straight...now will the “clock” toll on the Clockers on Tuesday??....
Ipswich (D3 N) – 10 – 1 Pentucket pops their balloon by 29 in their own gym in huge “power” game...club needs to get back on track in a hurry and I think they will...next real “power” opportunity is in the St. Mary’s Tourney in February.

Whitman Hanson (D2 S) – 9 – 2 Good season so far so have to start following this club as one loss is to top ranked New Bedford and the other by only 5...they are now on my radar.

Reading – (D2 N) -- 9 – 2 Loss at Woburn by 3 seemed to wake this club up as they’ve won 3 straight and will be favored in 2 this week setting up a home battle with Melrose on 2/1.

Needham (D1 S) – 6 – 5 Rizzo rolls ankle and Rockets regress...sorry as couldn't find the Walpole score.
Methuen (D1 N) – 7 – 5 Okay...can't figure this group out...thought they'd be closer in their "power" games but lost to Fenwick by 23 and Central Catholic by 26...allowing over 70 points each game...need to work on their "D."
